ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Dyal Singh College owes its origin to the extreme generosity and foresight of Sardar Dyal Singh Majithia, founder of 'The Tribune' and 'Punjab National Bank', who willed his vast wealth in 1895 for the setting up of an Education Trust for a truly secular college. Consequently, Dyal Singh College was established at Lahore in 1910. After the Partition of India, Dyal Singh College was established in Karnal and in Delhi. It started functioning in the capital as a constituent College of the University of Delhi in 1959 and was taken over by the University of Delhi as a University maintained institution in 1978.

The College Campus of over 11 acres is centrally located on Metro map at Lodhi Road in South Delhi in the vicinity of Lodhi Garden, Jawaharlal Nehru Sports Stadium, India Habitat Centre, India International Centre, CGO Complex and many other institutions of national/international significance.

Presently, the College is imparting education to over 5800 students, including foreign students from Afghanistan, Tibet & Nepal in 19 courses (including 12 honours & 2 post graduate courses) through 18 departments consisting of over 250 well qualified faculty members and over 100 non teaching staff members.

The college Library with the total collection of about 96,000 books and 53 journals / magazines is catering to the academic needs of the students and faculty. The college library is providing access to more than 3800 e-journals and 80,000 e-books after gaining membership to National Library and Information services Infrastructure for scholarly content (N-List) program of MHRD/UGC. To cater the need of visually challenged, library has been further equipped with JAWS software, scanner and Braille printer to provide IT based services to visually impaired students and faculty members.

College campus is wi-fi enabled and students have access to special softwares such as q-basic, Chemdraw, Treecon, Phylip, Phylodraw, Maxima, I3 & Mathematica.

Awards & Prizes

Awards and Prizes are conferred each year in recognition of merit in different fields.

The Dr. Ashok Kumar Memorial Prize is awarded to two students who secure first position in the Annual University Examination in the B.Sc (Hons) Physics First and Second Year respectively. Only student securing 60% or more marks in the main subject is eligible for the award. Additionally, the student must have cleared their qualifying subjects in the Annual Examination.

The Khwaja M.A. Hay Scholarship is awarded to a student of Third Year of the college who has passed the Second Year University Examination with at least 55% marks in Philosophy and has topped in Philosophy among the students of this College. Philosophy could either be the Main or Elective Subject of the Course.

Sh. P.C. Aggarwal and Smt. Sushma Aggarwal Memorial Prize is awarded to two male and two female students of B.Com.(H) Second Year and B.Com. (P) Second Year who score first position respectively. Only students securing 55% or more marks in the aggregate will be eligible for the award.

Dr. K.B. Mishra Prize is awarded to the students for securing highest mark in B.A. (H) Hindi II year.

Khwaja M.A. Hay prizes in Bengali, Punjabi, Sanskrit and Urdu are awarded for securing at least 55% marks in the subject and standing first in the subject in B.A. (Programme) II year examination conducted by Delhi University.

Sh. Mohan Lal Nanda Memorial Award is given to student of B.Sc. (H) Maths Part II securing highest marks with minimum 60% & clearing all subsidiary / qualifying subjects.

Smt. Ram Labhai Nanda Memorial Award is given to student of B.Sc. (H) Maths Part II securing second highest marks with minimum 55% & clearing all subsidiary / qualifying subjects.

Sh. Baij Nath Memorial Award is given to student of B.Sc. (H) Maths Part I securing highest marks with minimum 60% & clearing all subsidiary / qualifying subjects.

Smt. Shyam Pyari Memorial Award is given to student of B.A.(H) / B.Sc. (H) Maths Part I securing second highest marks with minimum 55% & clearing all subsidiary / qualifying subjects.

Smt. Pushpawati Memorial Prize is given to student of B.Sc. (Prog.) Applied Physical Science Part II securing at least 60% marks.

Sh. Sultan Chand Memorial Scholarship Endowment is given to student securing highest marks in B.Com(H) Semester I/Semester II /the 2nd highest marks (above 70%) in B.Com(H) II nd year subject to being not in receipt of any other scholarship / financial assistance.

Dr. Usha Aggarwal Tejaswi / Tejaswini Scholarship to a student who secures highest marks in B.Com (above 70%) in B.Com 1st year / II nd year, subject to being not in receipt of any other scholarship / financial assistance.

Qualifying Examinations

Qualifying examinations for the purpose of admission to the first year of undergraduate courses offered by the University shall be Senior Secondary School Certificate Examination (Class XII) of the Central Board of Secondary Education or an Examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

Candidate seeking admission to the courses offered by the University should have passed the qualifying examination obtaining minimum marks as specified for each of the courses in subsequent sections.

Age Requirement

There is no minimum age bar for admission to undergraduate courses.

Gap year(s) would be no bar for purposes of admission to the undergraduate courses.

The admission in any course shall not be granted on predicted scores issued by various Boards.

I. Procedure for calculation of 'Best Four' subjects percentage for Honours Courses (For admission to Arts/Humanities Courses):

- One Language (Core/Elective/Functional)
- The subject in which admission is sought (if a candidate does not include the concerned subject whether studied or not, in 'Best Four' in which he/she is seeking admission in the honours course,

then a deduction of 2.5% will be imposed on the calculated 'Best Four' percentage). For Honours in languages refer to point 12, also.

- c. Any two other academic/elective subjects as per List A.

Note :

- i. If a candidate doesn't include the subjects given in List A in 'Best Four', then a deduction of 2.5% of maximum marks will be levied for each subject for the purpose of calculating 'Best Four'.
- ii. All subjects to be included in the calculation of 'Best Four' must have at least 70% theory component of exam. In case, the subject to be considered does not have 70% theory component and 30% practical component, then the marks of theory and practical only shall be converted to 70% and 30%, respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four'.

List A

The following Discipline subjects must be treated as Academic/Elective subjects for the purpose of undergraduate admissions. All other subjects offered by different boards shall be treated as non-elective.

1. Accountancy/Business Studies / Commerce shall be treated at par with academic/elective subjects.
2. Biology/Biotechnology will be treated as academic/elective subjects.
3. In case a candidate has studied both elective and core in a language, then core language subject will be treated as language, while elective language can be considered as academic/elective subject.
4. The candidates must have studied and passed Mathematics at the qualifying exam for admission to B.A. (Honours) in Economics and Commerce.
5. Business Mathematics will be treated as equivalent to Mathematics for admission to B.Com(H)/B.Com only.
6. (a) For admission to Honours in any language course, advantage of 2% in the Best Four percentage may be given to those candidates who have studied that particular elective language.
(b) For admission to Honours in English and Hindi, the candidate must have studied and passed the respective language in the qualify in exam and should include respective language for calculation of 'Best Four' percentage.
7. University may define any other relevant subjects as an academic/elective for a particular Honours course.

II. Procedure for calculation of 'Best Four' subjects percentage for B.A.(Prog.)/B.Com(Prog.):

- a. One Language (Core/Elective/Functional)
- b. Any three elective subjects can be chosen. A deduction of 5% on 'Best Four' percentage shall be imposed if there is a change of stream.
- c. One non-listed (List A of Annexure-I) subject can be included in calculation of 'Best Four' without any deduction.
- d. For admission to B.A. (Vocational) only, related vocational subjects may be treated at par with academic/elective subjects and upto two vocational subjects which are in relationship with the course of study may be included for the calculation of 'Best Four'.
- e. If a candidate opts for MIL (Pb, Ur, Bn, Skt) as a subject, an advantage of upto 10% may be given in 'Best Four' subject to availability of seats. Refer respective cutoff list for specific %.

Note :

- i. If more than one non-listed subject is included for calculation of 'Best Four', a deduction of 2.5% each in 'Best Four' may be levied in addition to deduction due to change of stream, if any.
- ii. All subjects to be included in the calculation of 'Best Four' must have at least 70% theory component of exam. In case, the subject to be considered does not have 70% theory component and 30% practical component, then the marks of theory and practical only shall be converted to 70% and 30%, respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of 'Best Four' percentage are given below.

Admission to Science Courses

All the subjects to be included for Basis of Selection (PCM/PCB) must have at least 70% theory component exam. In case, the subject to be considered does not have 70% theory component and 30% practical component, then the marks of theory and practical only must be converted to 70% and 30%, respectively on pro rata basis. These new marks will then be considered for calculation of PCM/PCB etc.

 6. Report in the college for Orientation Program on 18.07.2016, 10 am alongwith fee receipt down loaded from university portal.

Note : Enclose Documents e-n in original plus self attested photocopies. o, p in original and q- self attested photocopy. Keep track of college website for relevant notice. Academic session shall begin on 20.7.16. classes shall be held six days a week 8am-5pm. Keep track of college website for University Enrolment form & Examination form.

The college will accept self-attested copies of documents/papers provided by the students. It is made clear that if any false attestation/falsified records are detected, the student will be debarred from attending any course in the University/ or its Colleges for next five years and in addition, a criminal case under relevant sections of IPC (viz, 470,471, 474 etc.) will be instituted against him/her.

Reservations and Relaxations

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste/Tribe Candidates

- 22% of the total number of seats is reserved for candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7% for Scheduled Tribes.)
- Relaxation to the extent of 5% in the minimum marks will be given to the candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and scheduled Tribes to determine their eligibility and merit for admission to the course concerned.
- In case, after giving 5% relaxation, the reserved seats still remain vacant, further relaxation would be given to the extent required in order to fill up all the reserved seats. (AC Resolution A88, 14.6.1983) (EC Resolution 157, 24121.2001). Eligibility in these cases is pass percentage.

The following are empowered to issue the certificate:

- a. District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Collector/Deputy Commissioner/Addl. Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/City Magistrate/Sub-Divisional Magistrate/Taluka Magistrate/Executive Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- b. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate.
- c. Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- d. Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and/or his family normally resides.
- e. Administrator/Secretary to the Administrator/Development Officer(Lakshadweep Islands).

Candidates must note that Certificate from any other person/authority shall not be accepted in any case. If the candidate happens to belong to SC or ST, his/her caste/tribe must be listed in the appropriate govt. of India schedule. The caste certificate should clearly state: (a) Name of his/her caste/tribe (b) whether he/she belongs to SC or ST (c) District and the State or Union Territory of his/her usual place of residence and (d) the appropriate Govt. of India schedule under which his/her caste/tribe is approved by it as SC or ST.

Candidates seeking admission under SC/ST/OBC category should have certificates in their own name only.

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC)

- 27% seats will be reserved for the candidates belonging to OBC.
- At the time of giving admission to an OBC candidates, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC. The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the candidate.
- The OBC candidates shall be given a relaxation of 10% in the minimum eligibility marks of the said course.
- If the seats meant for OBC remain vacant after arriving the minimum eligibility, the same may be converted and filled up by other eligible candidates subject to approval from the University.

Reservation of Seats for Persons with Disabilities (PwD)

Three percent, (3%) seats in all undergraduate and postgraduate institutions (including professional and technical institutions) will be reserved for candidates having minimum 40% disabilities.

Concessional/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons with Disabilities (PwD)

Consequent upon amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University, the following provision has been added after Sub-clause 2 of Ordinance X(4) of the said Ordinance.

“Provided that the persons with Physical Disabilities shall be waived off all the fees payable including the Examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University Students’ Union and Identity Card fee for pursuing under-graduate or post-graduate courses.

It is clarified further that the PwD students who are getting fellowships/financial assistance shall be exempted from payment of fees/charges subject to the following conditions.

All Eligible SC/ST, OBC, PwD students who are admitted to any college/Deptt. should submit their scholarship form by February for processing.

Reservation for Armed Forces (CW)

1. All candidates seeking admission to various undergraduate courses of University of Delhi will have to register online as per schedule notified by the University.
2. 5% of seats are reserved for candidates under CW categories course wise in all colleges.
3. All the CW candidates have to upload the Educational Concession certificate to be issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letter head.
 - Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi
 - Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board
 - Officer-in-charge, Record Office.
 - 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate.
 - Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)

Admission may be offered to the Children/Widows of Officers and Men of the Armed Forces including Para-Military Personnel, in the following order of preference:

- I. Widows/Wards of Defence personnel killed in action;
- II. Wards of serving personnel/ex-servicemen disabled in action;
- III. Widows/Wards of Defence personnel who died in peace time with death attributable to military service.
- IV. Wards of Defence personnel disabled in peace time with disability attributable to the military service; and

V. Wards of serving Ex-servicemen personnel including personnel of police forces who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards;

Gallantry Awards include: Param Vir Chakra, Ashok Chakra, Sarvottam Yudh Seva Medal, Mahavir Chakra, Kirti Chakra, Uttam Yudh Seva Medal, Vir Chakra, Shaurya Chakra, Yudh Seva Medal, Sena Nau Sena-Vayusena Medal, Mention-in-Despatches, President's Police Medal for Gallantry, Police Medal for Gallantry.

Registration of Kashmiri Migrants

1. All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants who wish to be considered for admission to various undergraduate courses for university have to register online as per schedule notified by the University.
2. 5% seats are reserved course-wise in all Colleges for wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
3. All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.
4. A concession of maximum 10% in the last cut-off marks fixed for General category candidates shall be extended to the Kashmiri Migrants (Refer cut off list for specific %).
5. Admission of Wards of Kashmiri Migrants will be based on cut-offs to be announced by the College. (The candidates selected under special Scholarship Scheme for J&K will be admitted directly to college)

Guidelines for Admission under Extra Curricular Activities (ECA)

The following guidelines for admission to various undergraduate courses on the basis of extra Curricular Activities (ECA) will be followed:

1. The existing provision of not more than 5% Sports and ECA quota (subject-wise) is continued as per circular no. Aca./Sports/2010-11/178 dated May 29, 2010.
2. (i) Candidates seeking admission under ECA category will register online on DU Admission portal.
(ii) The candidate seeking benefit of any participation/winning certificate must submit evidence of having participated in the concerned activity during the last three years (April 1, 2013 to 31 March, 2016).

Admission Procedure

- (i) Weightage will be given to the certificates for winners/participants at International, National, State, Zonal and School level and trials are as follows: Certificates: 25% Trials: 75%. The certificates to be considered should not be more than three years old.
- (ii) Not more than 15% concession in academic merit vis-a-vis general category candidates (last cut-off or 5th cut-off whichever is earlier) may be given for admission to specific courses (subject to the minimum eligibility of course).
- (iii) Trials will be held at two levels (i) Preliminary trials (ii) Final trials.
- (iv) Committee for preliminary trials
The colleges identified by Culture Council of University of Delhi will be conducting preliminary and final trials for a specific activity. The candidates should go through the notifications issued by the colleges and university on their website.
- (v) The date/dates for the Preliminary / Final trials shall be notified and displayed on the University Website and shall also be displayed on the College Notice Board well in advance.
- (vi) The candidates shall be allowed to appear at the preliminary level only once in an event.
- (vii) The list of the short listed candidates for final trials will be notified on the University Website, College Website and Notice Board for which the college been assigned the activity.
- (viii) The college shall videograph the preliminary and final trials and maintain records.

- (ix) The trials for admission under ECA category shall be conducted by the ECA Admission Committee. The ECA admission committee will be nominated by staff council of the college and the structure will be as follows:
- (i). Principal (Chairperson)
 - (ii) Culture Committee Incharge (Convenor)
 - (iii) Nominee/s of the Culture Council
 - (iv) At least two experts from
 - a. National School of Drama
 - b. Sri Ram Centre for Performing Arts
 - c. Faculty of Music & Fine Arts
 - d. Indian Council for Cultural Relations
 - e. College of Art
 - f. Sangeet Natak Academy
 - g. Sahitya Kala Parishad
 - h. All India Radio/Doordarshan ('A' Grade Artists)
 - i. Experts from University fraternity in areas of their expertise
- At least three members including two experts must be present throughout the trials for marking and evaluation.

Instructions

1. The allotment of course/subject to the qualified candidates shall conform to University regulations and will be the sole responsibility of the College.
2. The allotment of course/subject may be finalized by ECA Admission Committee which will include Chairperson (Principal), ECA /Cultural Committee and One faculty member nominated by the Staff Council.
3. The candidate must have secured at least 50% marks in final trials (38 out of 75) to be eligible, while preliminary round are qualifying.
4. The list of finally selected candidates containing marks of the ECA Certificates and Trials along with course/subject allotted shall be displayed on the College Website and Notice Board for three days to take cognizance of the grievances, if any.
5. A candidate having any grievance should apply to Grievance Committee of the College.
6. Merit list of the candidates selected for admission after the finals shall be notified on the respective College Website and the Notice Board. The admission of candidates thereafter will be completed on University Admission Portal as notified.
7. The ECA Admission Committee of the College shall:
 - a. screen the applicants/forms uploaded by the candidates
 - b. verify original ECA Certificate of the candidates as per marks allotted by ECA Committee.
8. An undertaking shall be submitted by the selected students at the time of admission stating that the candidate will perform for the College and University, all the years, during candidate's undergraduate course of study.
9. The candidate submitting false/fake certificate will be debarred from admission to any course in any college for three years. If a candidate is admitted on false/fake certificates, the candidate's admission will be cancelled and such cases will be notified to all the colleges.
10. The decision of ECA Admission Committee shall be final.

Guidelines for admission on the basis of Sports in Undergraduate courses

I. Super Category: Direct Admission without Sports Trials

Sports persons who have participated/represented the country in the following competition(s):

- Olympic Games by International Olympic Committee
- World Championships under International Sports Federations (IOA and / or MYAS recognized/affiliated Games)
- Asian Games by Olympic Council of Asia
- Asian Championships under International Sports Federations (IOA and / or MYAS recognized/affiliated Games)
- Commonwealth Games, S.A.F. Games and Afro-Asian Games (IOA and / or MYAS recognized/affiliated Games)
- Paralympic Games (IOC/IOA and/or MYAS recognized/affiliated Games)

II. Admission with Sports Trials

- Maximum 50 marks are for Sports Certificates.
- It is essential for the candidate to qualify any one of the following Fitness Test items for consideration of admission in Archery, Chess and Shooting, and any two of the following fitness Test items for consideration of admission in other Games/Sports as per the standards laid down by the University.

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- i. The College will be conducting Fitness Test and Sports Trials for a specific Sport/Game identified by Delhi University Sports Council (DUSC). The candidates should go through the notifications issued by the college and University on their Website.
- ii. If a candidate has opted for more than one Sports/Game and has qualified the Fitness Test in a particular college must be issued a Fitness Certificate by the college concerned in the given format. This certificate will be accepted by the other colleges.
- iii. Fitness Test is the qualifying test for subsequent process of screening/evaluating class XII documents, marking of Sports Certificates and Sports Trials and does not entitle the candidate for admission on the basis of Sports.

C. The Colleges shall video-graph the Fitness Test and Sports Trials.

D. Maximum 50 marks are for Sports Trials which include skill test, game performance test, game specific fitness, fundamentals of the game/sport etc.

- i. Minimum 25 marks are required to be obtained by the candidate in the Sports Trials to be eligible for admission on the basis of Sports.
- ii. Evaluation and Marking shall be done by the technical hands of Sports Admission Committee.

E. Composition of the Sports Admission Committee for specific Sport(s)/Game(s) identified by DUSC:

- i. Chairperson : Principal
- ii. Convener : Teacher-in-charge, Deptt. of Physical Education
- iii. Physical Education Teacher(s) as member(s).
- iv. Expert/s nominated by the Chairperson (Principal) from the confidential list sent by the DUSC.
- v. Nominee/s of the Delhi University Sports Council.
- vi. One Nominee of the Vice Chancellor (as Observer).

The Committee can co-opt one/two regular bonafide sports/s(M/W) for assistance.

Note:

1. The allotment of course/subject to the qualified candidates shall conform to University regulations and will be the sole responsibility of the College. The allotment of course/subject may be finalized by the Sports Admission Committee of the college which will include Chairperson (Principal), Convener (Teacher in-charge, Department of Physical Education), Physical Education Teacher(s) as member(s) and One faculty member nominated by the Staff Council.
2. The list of finally selected candidates containing marks of the Sports Certificates and Sports Trials along with course/subject allotted shall be displayed on the College Website and Notice Board for three days to take cognizance of the grievances, if any.
3. A candidate having grievances should apply to Grievance Committee of the College.
4. The Sports Admission Committee of the College shall:
 - a. screen the applications/forms uploaded by the candidates.
 - b. verify original Sports Certificate of the candidates as per marks allotted by DUSC
5. The level of competency of the candidate in the Sports/Games will be determined only for those who have achieved distinction in Sports/Games during the last three years in the Sports/Games recognized by AIU and IOA. Preference will be given to Sports/Games in which Delhi University Inter-College and Inter-University Competitions/Tournaments are held.
6. The level of distinction of certificates will be determined from 1st April, 2013 to 31st March, 2016.
7. The candidate as per their age must be eligible to participate in Inter-University Competitions/Tournaments for the next three years and should not be employed Part-time/full time anywhere.
8. It is mandatory to submit an undertaking on Judicial Stamp paper of Rs. 100/- by the selected sports persons at the time of admission stating that they will play for the College and University during their under-graduate course of study.

Important Notes

1. No individual intimation regarding admission will be sent. All announcements regarding admission to various courses will be put up on the College Notice Board/Website.
2. Candidates selected for admission, in accordance with the criteria laid down, will report to the relevant Admission Committee in the room allotted along with their Original Certificates/Testimonials as well as self attested Photostat Copies of the documents listed in the section "steps to follow for Admission" and submit the same along with the enclosed form/sheet.
3. Applicants admitted to the College will have to deposit the prescribed fees within the period specified by the university. Failure to do so will automatically result in cancellation of admission.
4. The College reserves the right to refuse admission to any candidate without assigning any reason.
5. All admissions are provisional and subject to verification of certificates & approval of competent authority/University of Delhi.
6. **Any student submitting false/fake/forged certificates and indulging in any sort of forgery will be debarred from admission to all courses in the University or its Colleges for the next 5 years and would be liable to suitable legal action under IPC 470, 471, 474 etc.**
7. **No student is permitted to take admission / pursue 02 degree courses simultaneously either from the two colleges of University of Delhi or from other University simultaneously except the part time diplomas / certificates of the University of Delhi. Such admission will be cancelled.**
8. The admission in any course shall not be granted on predicted scores.
9. Students from outside Delhi should inform the name and address of local guardian at the time of admission and should communicate their local address by August 31, 2016.
10. It is the responsibility of the student and his/her guardian to ascertain periodically from the College Office, or the teachers concerned his/her attendance position.
11. Students, who fall sick during the year, or attend recognized camps, and tournaments, etc. must submit Merit Certificate / certificate/s of participation in camps and tournaments for such period of absence to the College Office within 7 days of resuming the college and obtain a receipt thereof, so that due credit for attendance is given to them in accordance with the rules laid down in this respect by the University. Late medical certificate or certificate of participation shall not be entertained.
12. Eligible SC/ST, OBC, PWD students should submit their scholarship form for the academic year by February each year.

Withdrawal

A student, who wishes to leave the College, must apply in the enclosed prescribed form to the Principal and the application must be countersigned by his/her father/mother/guardian. A student is liable to pay all fees, fines and other College dues until his/her name is formally withdrawn. A student dropping out without such a formal withdrawal shall be charged fees, etc., till his/her name is struck off. If he/she fails to pay the amount due, his/her Security Deposit shall be forfeited and adjusted towards his/her fee account.

Rules for Fee Refund

Detention

The Principal has the power to detain a student in any class or debar him from being sent up for a University Examination under the relevant University Rule (58 Ref, A.C. No. 78 Dated 15-7-60 and No. 269, dated 8-12-60).

Fee Concession

The College offers Fee Concession/Financial Aid/Stipend to deserving students. The financial assistance will be continued only if the student's progress in his/her studies is satisfactory. The decision of the College regarding fee concessions will be final. Those desirous of availing concession are required to submit family income proof.

Identity Card / Bus Pass

After admission to the College every student will be issued an Identity Card. They are required to wear it in the college premises. Failure to do so will render a student liable to disciplinary action. The card must be returned when the student leaves the College.

Library Card

ORDINANCES

Ordinance VII (2)

- a. A candidate for the Semester I/III/V Examination shall not be deemed to have satisfied the required conditions of attendance unless s/he has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than two thirds of the lectures/practical/presentations/tutorials required to be attended provided that a student of the Semester I/III/V who does not fulfil the required conditions of attendance, as above, but has attended, in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 per cent of lectures/practical/presentations during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the College concerned, appear for the ensuing semester Examination; but such a candidate shall be required to make up the deficiency at lectures and practicals, in the next semester of the same academic year.

Provided that a student of the II/IV/ VI semester who does not fulfill the required conditions of attendance as above, but has attended in all the subjects taken together, not less than 40 per cent of the lectures/practical/presentation/tutorials, held during the respective semester, may at the discretion of the Principal of the college concerned, be allowed to appear at the ensuing examination provided that s/he makes up the deficiency of the said attendance by combining the attendance of the previous semester in the ensuing semester.

Provided further that the Principal of the College concerned may permit a student to appear in an examination notwithstanding that the student has not fulfilled the attendance requirement, if in the opinion of the Principal, such student shall make up the deficiency in the succeeding academic year.

Provided further that a student of the II/IV/VI semester shall be allowed to appear at the II/IV/VI Semester Examination, as the case may be, if by combining the attendance of the one/two/three academic years as the case may be, the candidate has put in two-thirds of attendance, in all the subjects taken together, held during the respective years.

- b. In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the N.C.C to participate in the annual N.C.C. Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignments by or with the approval of the Principal/ Head of the institution concerned or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter University Board or in national or international fixtures in games and sports approved by the Competent Authority or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter College sports or fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia or social work projects or a student who is required curricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Principal/Vice-Chancellor for this purpose. In calculating the total number of lectures etc. delivered in the College, or in the University as the case may be, for his course of study in each academic year, the number of lectures etc. in each subject delivered, during the period of absence and as approved by the principal for that purpose shall deemed to have been attended by the student.
- c. The Principal of a College may consider, on the basis of the Medical Certificates produced, exceptionally hard cases of students who had fallen seriously ill or had met with an accident during

- the year disabling them from attending classes for a certain period, with a view to determining whether the lectures etc. delivered during the said period, or a part thereof, could be excluded for purposes of calculation of attendance of the year and decide each case on its own merits.
- d. Colleges shall be required to notify the attendance position of each of its students for each month on the noticeboard of the College, and clearly indicate the lectures/practical hold subject wise and the numbers attended by each student.
 - e. A College shall notify on the notice board the final attendance position of each of its students within five days of the dispersal of the classes in the last session of the academic year Not later than five days, thereafter, a student may, by and application to the Principal of the college claim benefit of exclusion of lectures under sub-clause (a) above on grounds to be specified and accompanied by the relevant documents. All such applications submitted within time shall be considered and disposed of by the Principal of the College at least 3 days prior to the commencement of the examination, in which the student is intending to appear.
 - f. The benefit of exclusion of lectures contemplated in para 'c' above shall in no case exceed 1/3 of the total number of lectures practicals / presentations / tutorials delivered .
 - g. In the case of a married woman student who is granted maternally leave, in calculating the total number of lectures delivered in the College or in the University. As the case may be, for her course of study in each semester, the number of lectures in each subject delivered during the period of her maternity leave shall not be taken in to account.
 - h. No person shall be deemed to have satisfied the required conditions in respect of his instructions, unless in addition to the requirements regarding attendance and other conditions, he has appeared and satisfied by his performance the Principal of the College in such tests, written and / or oral, as may be held by him in his discretion. The Principal of the College Shall have and shall be deemed always to have had, the power to detain a student in the same class in which he has been studying, or not to send him up for the University Examination, in case he did not appear at the tests aforesaid or his performance was not satisfactory. The Principal of a College/ Head of the Institution shall have power to strike off the name of a student who is grossly irregular in attendance inspite of warning, or when the absence of the student is for such a long period that he cannot put in requisite percentage of attendance.

Ordinance VIII (2)

For all the students obtaining admissions under the Three Year Under-graduate programme under CBCS, the span period to complete the course will be 6 years from the year of admission in the first semester, irrespective of the different courses provided the student has completed all requirements to become eligible for appearing in the University Examinations as per rules.

Ordinance IX

Pass Percentage and Promotion Rules

- a. A student who appears in an odd semester examinations or who was eligible to appear in the odd semester examinations but remains absent in any or all the papers of the said semester, shall move on to the next even semester irrespective of his/her result in the said examinations.
- b. A student who has obtained 40% on the aggregate taking together all the papers in theory examination (including internal assessment/project work) and practical examination separately conducted in 1st and 2nd semester shall be promoted to the second academic year/IIIrd semester.

c. A student who has obtained 40% on the aggregate taking together all the papers in theory examination (internal assessment/project work) and practical examinations separately, conducted in IIIrd and IVth semester shall be promoted to the third academic year/Vth semester.

d. Students who do not fulfil the promotion criteria mentioned above shall be declared fail in the promotion examination of the academic year concerned. However, they shall have the option to retain the marks in the papers in which they want to retain.

e. If a student has secured an aggregate of minimum 40% marks taking together all the papers in theory examination (including internal assessment/project, wherever applicable) and practical exam separately till the end of third year, i.e., upto the end of the Vth semester, then she/he shall be awarded the degree in which the student has been admitted.

f. A student who wants to re-appear for improvement in marks in a paper prescribed for semester I/III/V may do so only in the semester examinations to be held in November-December. A student who wants to re-appear for improvement in a paper prescribed in semester II/IV/VI may do so only in the examinations to be held in May/June.

Re-appearance for improvement

a. A student may re-appear in any theory paper prescribed for a semester, on foregoing in writing her/his previous performance in the paper/s concerned. This can be done in the immediate subsequent semester examination only (for example, a student re-appearing in paper prescribed for semester I examination may do so along with subsequent semester IIIrd examination and not along with papers for semester Vth).

b. A candidate who has cleared examinations of third academic year (Vth and Vith semesters) may re-appear in any paper of V or VI semester only once, at the immediate subsequent examinations on foregoing in writing her/his previous performance in the paper/s concerned, within the prescribed span period.

(Note: The candidate of this category will not be allowed to join any post-graduate courses)

c. In the case of re-appearance in paper, the result will be prepared on the basis of candidate's current performance in the examinations.

(d) In the case of a candidate, who opts to re-appear in any paper/s under the aforesaid provisions, on surrendering her/his earlier performance but fails to reappear in the paper/s concerned, the marks previously secured by the candidate in the paper/s in which she/he has failed to re-appear shall be taken into account while determining her/his result of the examination held currently.

(f) All papers of Core, Elective, Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) shall be for 100 marks each and 25 marks shall be for Internal Assessment (IA).

(g) Examination for Practical wherever applicable shall be based on continuous evaluation.

(h) Duration of end semester theory examinations of Core and Elective subjects shall be three hours.

(i) There shall be no internal assessment in practical papers.

(j) There shall be no supplementary examinations.

Ordinance XV -B

Maintenance of discipline among Students and University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary actions are vested in the Vice-Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:

- a. Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi
 - b. Carrying of, use of or threat to use of any weapons
 - c. Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - d. Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes.
 - e. Any practice-whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women.
 - f. Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner.
 - g. Willful destruction of institutional property.
 - h. Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds.
 - i. Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the University system.
 - j. Prohibition of Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of maintaining discipline as may seem to him/her appropriate, the Vice-Chancellor, may in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid order or direct that any student or students-
- a. be expelled; or
 - b. be, for a stated period rusticated; or
 - c. be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a College, Department or Institution of the University; or
 - d. be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - e. be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examination for one or more years; or
 - f. that the result of the student or students concerned in the examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Open Learning and Librarians shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the University as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.
6. Without prejudice to the powers of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed ruled of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the rules rules that have been framed therein by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C

Prohibition and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited, within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance, ordinarily means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students; and includes individual or collective acts or practices which-
 - a. involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force
 - b. violate the status, dignity and honour of women students
 - c. violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribe
 - d. expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem
 - e. entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department or an Institution, the authorities of College, or University Hostel or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo motu enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-Chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.
7. If the Principal of a College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.
8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.
9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3(a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.
10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years or that the results of the student or students concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared be cancelled.
11. In case any students who have obtained degrees or diplomas of Delhi University are found guilty; under this Ordinance, appropriate action will be taken under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees or diploma conferred by the University.
12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging whether by way of any act, practice or incitement of ragging will also amount to ragging.
13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instruction/directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

Note: Order of the Vice-Chancellor in pursuance of Ordinance XV-C:

Where incident (s) of ragging are reported to the Vice-Chancellor by any authority under this Ordinance, the students (s) involved in ragging, shall be expelled for a specified term, designated in the order. Non-students involved in reports of ragging will be proceeded with under the criminal law of India; they will also be rendered ineligible for period of five years from seeking enrolment in any of the institutions of the University of Delhi. Students against whom necessary action is taken under this note, will be given post decisional hearing, with strict adherence to the rules of natural justice.

ORDINANCE XV-D

The Sexual Harassment of women at work place (Prevention, Prohibition & Redressal) Act 2013.

An Act to provide protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for matters connected therewith incidental thereto

WHEREAS sexual harassment results in violation of the fundamental rights of a woman to equality under articles 14 and 15 of the Constitution of India and her right to life and to live with dignity under article 21 of the Constitution and right to practice any profession or to carry on any occupation, trade or business which includes a right to a safe environment free from sexual harassment.

AND WHEREAS the protection against sexual harassment and the right to work with dignity are universally recognized human rights by international conventions and instruments such as Convention on the Elimination of all forms of discrimination against Women, which has been ratified on the 25th June, 1993 by the Government of India.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to make provisions for giving effect to the said Convention for protection of women against sexual harassment at workplace.

Section 9 - Complaint of sexual harassment.

- (1) Any aggrieved woman may make in writing a complaint of sexual harassment at workplace to the Internal Committee within a period of three months from the date of incident and in case of a series of incidents within a period of three months from the date of last incident:

Provided that where such complaint cannot be made in writing, the Presiding officer or any member of the Internal Committee shall render all reasonable assistance to the woman for making the complaint in writing :

Provided further that the Internal Committee May for the reasons to be recorded in writing, extend the time limit not exceeding three months, if it is satisfied that the circumstances were such which prevented the woman from filing a complaint within the said period.

- (2) Where the aggrieved woman is unable to make a complaint on account of her physical or mental incapacity or death or otherwise, her legal heir or such other person as may be prescribed may make a complaint under this section.

Section 14 - Punishment for false or malicious complaint and false evidence.

- (1) Where the Internal Committee arrives at a conclusion that the allegation against the respondents is malicious or the aggrieved woman or any other person making the complaint has made the complaint knowing it to be false or the aggrieved woman or any other person making the complaint has produced any forged or misleading document, it may recommend to the employer or the District

Officer as the case may be to take action against the woman or the person who has made the complaint under sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) of section 9 as the case may be, in accordance with the provisions of the service rules applicable to her or him or where no such service rules exist, in such manner as may be prescribed:

Provided that a mere inability to substantiate a complaint or provide adequate proof need not attract action against the complainant under this section:

Provided further that the malicious intent on parts of the complainant shall be established after an inquiry in accordance with the procedure prescribed, before any action is recommended.

- (2) Where the Internal Committee arrives at a conclusion that during the inquiry any witness has given false evidence or produced any forged or misleading document, it may recommend to the employer of the witness or the District Officer as the case may be to take action in accordance with the provisions of the service rules applicable to the said witness or where no such service rules exist in such manner as may be prescribed.

Admission process at the colleges after fifth cut-off list

If the seats remain vacant after fifth cut-off list, the following process shall be followed to fill vacant seats in the colleges.

- i. The colleges shall notify the status of vacant seats (course-wise and category-wise) on the university portal as well as on their website and college notice board.
- ii. Only those candidates who had registered earlier on the UG admission portal will be eligible for this admission process. The candidate is again required to apply online through UG admission portal and choose the course/college wherever seats are available and as per the notified schedule only.

- iii. The application of such candidates will be received online only for 3 days, each in two phases.
- iv. The college will prepare a merit list of all candidates who have applied in the college online with their names, online registration number and Best of Four/PCM/PCB etc. (whichever is applicable) for each course and display the complete merit list on its website and notice board.
- v. The college will also notify the merit list with names and registration number of candidates eligible for admission against vacant seats.
- vi. The admission of the candidates, whose names appear in the merit list prepared by the college for each course, will be admitted in next two days on merit basis only against vacant seats. The admission process will however be only online as earlier.
- vii. Three such lists with names of eligible candidates for admission as per the seats available should be brought out according to the schedule announced by the University.
- viii. After three such cut-offs, if the seats still remain vacant or the list has been exhausted, the college will again invite applications online through university portal as above (points 2& 3). The subsequent admission process will be similar as notified (refer points 1 to 6).
- ix. If there is more than one applicant with same Best O4/PCM/PCB & one seat in a course, then aggregate marks of class XII (as per course wise requirements) shall be considered. If these are also same, then all such candidates shall be admitted.
