Besides this the college has been awarded the DDU KAUSHAL(Deen Dayal Upadhyay – Knowledge Acquisition and Upgradation of Skilled Human Abilities and Livelihood) Kendra (2016) by UGC and Teaching Learning Centre (2017) by the Ministry of Education. The College also offers short-term diploma, certificates, and executive development programmes on contemporary and skill-oriented themes to complement the regular graduation courses. It is also the Study Centre of School of Open Learning (SOL), Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB) and Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) for various courses.

CONCEPT NOTE

Rooted in the Vedic texts and further developed through centuries of scholarly inquiry, the Indian Knowledge System reflects a holistic worldview that integrates science, ethics, and metaphysics. In contemporary times, there is renewed interest in IKS due to its potential to offer alternative solutions to modern challenges, including mental health, environmental sustainability, education, and wellness. The Indian government and academic institutions are actively working to integrate IKS into mainstream education and research, recognizing its relevance in the global knowledge landscape. Thus, the Indian Knowledge System is not just a relic of the past but a living tradition that continues to inform, inspire, and guide human progress through its comprehensive, integrative, and timeless wisdom.
